A One-day International Management Conference on 'Business and Economy: Growth, Governance and Globalisation' was organised on March 5th, 2016 by

Fortune Institute of International Business (FIIB), Vasant Vihar, New Delhi. Mr. M S Sahoo, Member, Competition Commission of India was the Chief Guest of the Conference.
